## GOVERNMENT and LAW

### IMMIGRANTS

47. Comprehensive immigration reform that includes promotes these policies:
  - a. Extend the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program until the Passage of the Development, Relief and Education for Alien Minors ([DREAM](#)) Act.
  - b. Prevent family separation, support family reunification, and increase special protections for minors.
  - c. Oppose efforts to make state and local law enforcement responsible for enforcing federal immigration [laws](#).
  - d. Provide a path for individuals, regardless of immigration status, to purchase vehicle insurance and obtain a [driver's license](#) in Iowa.
  - e. Provide additional services for integrating immigrants, asylum seekers, and refugees.
  - f. Acknowledge importance of immigration in reinvigorating our labor force.

### TRANSPORTATION

48. Funding expansion of mass transit resources by renewing the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.
49. Establish environmentally sensitive and economically usable mass transit to, within, and across the State of Iowa. This future oriented system would include:
  - a. Restoration of the [State of Iowa Rail Plan](#).
  - b. The State of Iowa should join the [Midwest Interstate Passenger Rail \(MIPR\) Compact](#).
  - c. Improve bus, rail, and air connectivity for rural public transportation.
  - d. Improve automotive and truck transportation surfaces.

## **CAMPAIGNS, ELECTIONS, AMERICAN INSTITUTIONS**

50. Maintain integrity of elections by:
  - a. Securing elections against foreign and domestic interference and protecting voter rights by way of the [John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act](#) of 2021.
  - b. Overturning [Citizens United](#) and enacting comprehensive campaign finance reform.
  - c. Enacting impartial redistricting laws to prevent [gerrymandering](#).
  - d. Adopting a constitutional amendment to protect voter rights.
  - e. Adopting [ranked choice voting](#).
51. We demand the enforcement of the Constitutional checks & balances and that the Legislative and Judicial Branches exercise their Constitutional authority. Democrats call on Congress to pass legislation banning all elected and appointed state and federal officials and their families from stock trading.
52. Enforce the [Emoluments Clause](#).
53. Instituting appropriate term limits at all levels and branches of government.

## **CRIMINAL AND RACIAL JUSTICE**

54. Reformation of law enforcement agencies at all levels through demilitarization, emphasizing respecting due process and improving community policing.
55. Adequate funding for judicial systems.
56. Publicly (not privately) owned and operated correctional systems that rehabilitate and assist offenders to become contributors to a civil and just society.
57. Protection from coercive non-disclosure agreements of persons alleging sexual harassment.
58. Support decriminalization, legalization, and expungement of cannabis drug convictions at the national and state levels for adults, and release inmates held solely for nonviolent cannabis crimes.
59. Disengage with the punitive nature of criminal sentencing.
60. Programs aiding in the transition from [institutional restrictive living](#).
61. Educating and enforcing measures to end human trafficking and increasing efforts to support the rehabilitation of human trafficking victims.

## **CIVIL RIGHT & CIVIL LIBERTIES**

62. Codification of [The Declaration of Human Rights](#).
63. Equality of all opportunities and elimination of discriminatory practices - not limited to pay, housing, education, employment, and commerce.

64. Develop and expand services based on the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

## **FIREARMS**

65. Uphold the Second Amendment rights while reinforcing common sense safety measures that include:
  - a. Universal background checks, mandatory registration of all gun purchases, and maintaining a “weapon-free zone.”
  - b. Authorize sheriffs to deny permits to persons who are adjudicated mentally ill, on the “no-fly” list, or convicted of domestic violence.
  - c. Ban kits or parts that would convert semi-automatic weapons to fully automatic weapons.

## **TAXATION & SOCIAL SECURITY**

66. Supporting and enforcing legislation that requires the wealthy and corporations to pay their proportionate share to reduce the tax burden on the middle- and lower-class population and close tax loopholes.
67. Protection of historic preservation tax credits and TIFs (Tax Increment Financing).
68. Ensure fiscal viability of the Social Security Program.

## **MILITARY & VETERANS**

69. Improve funding for the [Iowa Department of Veterans Affairs](#) and [Iowa Veterans Trust Fund](#).
70. Subsidize counties for timely access and delivery of veterans’ services.
71. Maintain state income tax exemptions for military retirement or disability pay of personnel with Iowa as their primary residence.
72. Continue [Military Service Ownership Assistance](#).
73. Increase funding for [Iowa Veterans Home](#).
74. Actively recruit veterans for civilian employment.
75. Expand Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act ([USERRA](#)).
76. Protect jobs for veterans with disabilities incurred while on active duty.
77. Support and increase measures centered on ending homelessness among our veterans.
78. Maintain county [Veterans Services Office \(VSO\)](#) funding.

## **HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

### **GENERAL HEALTHCARE, REIMBURSEMENT & COVERAGE**

79. Single-payer healthcare system that is accessible and affordable to all Iowans, includes vision, hearing, behavioral, and brain health treatment, and allows the government to negotiate prescription drug costs.
80. Right to self-determination for healthcare decisions.

85. Financial support for public health agencies to provide preventative health screening and public health education.

86. Fully fund social programs, food assistance programs, and affordable quality housing for low-income and the elderly, and the [Iowa Department of Aging](#) through public, not-for-profit organizations.
87. Fully funding and utilizing state inspectors and ombudsman positions to follow state and federal safety guidelines for safety of Iowa nursing home residents.

## **CHILDREN & FAMILIES**

### **LGBTQIA+**

88. Accessibility and affordability of gender-affirming healthcare options.

## **MENTAL HEALTH & ADDICTIONS**

89. Fully funding brain healthcare and services that utilize researched best practice models.
90. Recognition and treatment of addiction as a healthcare issue.

## **REPRODUCTIVE RIGHTS & FAMILY PLANNING**

91. Protection of the individual's right to personal, accessible, and affordable reproductive healthcare decisions.

## **VETERAN HEALTH**

92. Continue funding for the [Injured Veterans Grant Program](#).
93. Ensure reduction of long wait times, increased clarity of eligibility requirements, and establishment of accountability for privatized veterans' health care providers.
94. Improve physical and mental health treatment for veterans.
95. Secure coverage for veteran, military family, and civilian victims of [Agent Orange](#) and [burn pit](#)-related health issues (including second and third-generations)

## INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

### PEACE & SECURITY

96. Provide U.S. leadership in diplomatic conflict resolution and support of [human rights](#) for all people, including the right of self-governance and self-determination.
97. Ensure economic and participatory support for The [United Nations](#), World Health Organization ([WHO](#)) and for The North Atlantic Treaty Organization ([NATO](#)).
98. Adhere to [Geneva Convention](#) agreements with respect to prisoner treatment and prosecution of violators.
99. Elevate [Bureau of Conflict Resolution](#) to cabinet-level status to more effectively resolve world conflicts.

### ISREAL/PALESTINE

100. After decades of violence, the [Israeli and Palestinian peoples](#) deserve to live safely and freely within secure borders.
  - a. Commitment to a sovereign Palestinian state within the June 4, 1967 lines based on United Nation Security Council Resolutions 242 and 338, which have been annually reaffirmed by the UN and is the international consensus. Opposition to ongoing military suppression of occupied Palestinian Territories (which include the West Bank, East Jerusalem, and the Gaza Strip). A just resolution between Palestine and Israel should be based on United Nation General Assembly Resolution 194 for the return of Palestinian Refugees of 1948, after an end-of-conflict treaty between the Palestinian and Israeli states, followed by normalization between Israel and the Arab states.

### RUSSIA/UKRAINE

101. Support Ukraine's sovereignty and defense.

### IMMIGRATION

102. Remove restrictions on visas that make it difficult for immigrants to work and attend school at the same time.
103. Include long-term protection for asylum seekers/refugees from conflict zones.
104. Decrease reliance on physical barriers and force in border security by utilizing technology and timely legal processes.
105. Support establishment of international relationships fostering human rights as outlined in International Affairs.
106. Promote timely application processing, issue work permits, and create an expedited [roadmap to citizenship](#).
107. Fast-track T and U Visas for survivors of human trafficking.

## **MILITARY**

108. Ensure physical and economic protection of non-combatant civilians and children in war

## **NUCLEAR/WMDs/CONVENTIONAL WEAPONS**

109. Achieve international agreements to end proliferation and use of nuclear weapons, landmines, chemical weapons, cluster bombs, and cyber warfare.

## **TRADE**

110. Negotiating trade agreements that are transparent and environmentally responsible and that safeguard:
  - a. Rights and best interests of the American public.
  - b. U.S. jobs.
  - c. The well-being of populations in countries where the U.S. imports goods and materials.
111. We oppose tariffs that are unconstitutionally levied or without prior congressional approval.
112. Develop assistance for emerging countries through the [International Monetary Fund](#) and [World Food Program](#) to promote long-lasting growth, an improvement in trade, and an increase in economic opportunity.
